
All events take place at the Toman's King Camp and Alaska Kingfishers.

Place Names

Connections with land are essential to Bristol Bay culture. Each place has a story. Where there are berries or salmon, there are names. These place names were not written on paper, but kept in a community's understanding of its place. Here are a few place names near the Nushagak.

lilgayaq - Nushagak River and name of Bristol Bay

Def: Possibly means a place to hide – the root word of lilgayaq is "iiq" to hide. Everyone could identify the location on a map, but no one could explain the meaning of the name. Elders said it's a name that the elders were born into, and is a river name that people long ago named and our generation and their generation know it with no meaning.

Curyung: Dillingham: Choggiung

Def: Possibly related to murky, dirty like tea. Located at the extreme northern end of the Nushagak Bay in northern Bristol Bay at the confluence of the Wood and Nushagak Rivers.

Akulivikcaq - Ekwok Lodge

Def: Area between. May be simply a place name or may reference the small creek that formerly divided the site into two equal parts. Located on the west bank of Nushagak River approximately 5 kilometers downstream of Ekwok. This was considered an important site and one of the largest on the river.

Iquaq - Ekwok

Def: End of bluff. Located on the right bank of the Nushagak just above the mouth of Klutuk Creek, 43 miles northeast of Dillingham. It is the oldest continuously occupied Eskimo village on the river. The first post office established in 1935 known as "Ekwok."
